- 1. Clarification regarding applicability or otherwise of judgment of Hon'ble Supreme Court of India in Civil Appeal No.3609 of 2017, "Deepa E.V. versus Union of India and others" Consideration of reserved candidates with higher merits against general/unreserved seats for admission to MBBS/BDS.
- 2. Regarding a) Fee Structure and b) UG Bond for MBBS admission at ESIC Medical College and Hospital, Faridabad for academic session 2017-18.

Reference subject cited above.

I have been directed to intimate you that during the meeting of Admission 2. Committee held on 07.07.2017 in which Pro Vice Chancellor Dr. V.K. Jain, Pt. B.D. Sharma University of Health Sciences, Rohtak had mentioned about the judgment dated April 6, 2017 in Civil Appeal No. 3609 of 2017 - "Deepa E.V. versus Union of India and others". He desired to know whether this judgment was applicable for admissions to MBBS/BDS for the academic session 2017-18. The matter was put up to Hon'ble Chief Minister, Haryana who desired to seek legal opinion of Advocate General, Haryana. The Department has sought legal opinion from Advocate General, Haryana and based on the same, it has been decided that if a student/candidate has availed of any concession, such as relaxation in upper age limit, qualification or permitted number of chances in written examination then he/she cannot be considered against general/unreserved seats. However, if any candidate belonging to any of the reserved categories has higher merit and has not availed of any relaxation in upper age limit, qualification or permitted number of chances in NEET/written examination (except fee concession for registration fee), then he/she shall be considered against general/unreserved seat as per his/her merit (rank) and choice. Necessary action may be taken in this regard accordingly.

- 3. With regard to point No.2 of the above, it is intimated that Dean, ESIC Medical College & Hospital, Faridabad vide his letter dated 17.07.2017 has intimated that a) Tuition Fee of Rs.1,00,000/- (Rs. one lakh only) per annum against ESIC Medical College and Hospital, Faridabad may be included in the Prospectus issued by the University.
- b) Students seeking admission at ESIC Medical College and Hospital, Faridabad shall have to submit UT Bond as a pre condition to admission, may also be included in the Prospectus of the University. The details of the UG Bond and Proforma are available on the website; www.esic.nic.in.

In view of above, you are requested to issue a corrigendum with regard to (a) and (b) above immediately.
